



CARE AND CLEANING OF VARNISHED WOOD FLOORING

In order that the concept of “hardness” is associated with a real wood floor, the room has to be subject to normal use and a maintenance plan has to be put in place.

Normal use means that certain precautions have to be carried out to protect against abrasive materials, such as sand or gravel and also against furniture legs where the castors are not suitable (in the case of arm chairs, TV tables...).

In other words, for a wood flooring to last well, one should consider a suitable wood species at the outset and prescribe the correct cleaning methods.

Everyday cleaning be carried out with a soft broom or a vacuum cleaner.

Marks and light stains are wiped off using a sponge or lightly dampened cloth.

For more stubborn stains like fruit stains, coffee, tea, drinking chocolate, tar, ink, grease, lip-stick....rub the area with a cloth which has been lightly dampened with acetone (nail-varnish remover).

Only use neutrals detergents.

For future protection, use a metalizing liquid (metallisant) that will leave a protective layer, which maintains the floor and facilitates future renovation.
